



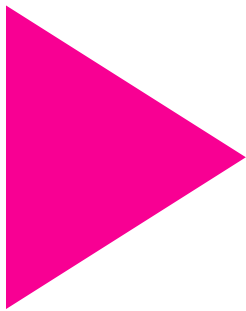

The Right to Play

The Jersey Youth Parliament is a group that work together to find out what is important to other young people. They are looking at three big issues that affect young people in Jersey and have shared their research with the adults who are able to affect change.

United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child - Article 31



Every child has the right to rest and leisure, to engage in play and recreational activities appropriate to the age of the child and to participate freely in cultural life and the arts.

We would like to teenagers to have more places to hang out with their friends and that they are affordable.



In the future we would like to make sure every child feels safe using facilities and outdoor public spaces in Jersey.



We were very shocked to see how low physical activity standards are within secondary schools.



We launched a survey to ask other young people about their interests.



We looked at the activities available to young people in Jersey as well as the barriers that prevent them from getting involved such as transport and age limits and limited free time.





Many young people thought that activities cost too much money.



The Jersey Youth Parliament think that government action is needed to improve the island for young people.



Pricing of Facilities

- Cheaper facilities and more accessible
- Introduce a free pass for young people to access sports centres



Bus Routes

- Keep the £20 student pass
- Improve the service at weekends
- Better information about routes



Physical Education

- Play park in every parish
- Open up sports facilities for young people to use
- Keep school playgrounds and pitches open after school and evenings



Safer Environments

- Ensure that parks are kept safe and clean for all young people
